Spectator Buses: from Launceston: Leave the Transit Centre at 7:30 am on Saturday and Sunday, returning from Derby at 5pm on Saturday and 8:30pm on Sunday after Luca Brasi. Tickets are \$50 return and for an extra \$10 you can put your bike on the trailer. Ring Sainty's on 6323 1555 for bookings.

Parking: There is plenty of parking available and for gold coin donation a local community group will direct you or follow the parking direction signs.

Road Closures: Please note Main Street Derby will be closed Saturday and Sunday. 7:45am to 5pm, Saturday 8 April. 7:45am – 8.00pm Sunday 9 April.
